Property and Stock Agents Amendment (Underquoting and Other Agent Conduct) Bill 2026

Explanatory note

This explanatory note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.

Overview of Bill

The object of this Bill is to amend—

- (a) the *Property and Stock Agents Act 2002* (the **PSA Act**) in relation to the underquoting of selling prices of residential property by real estate agents and other agent conduct, and
- (b) the *Fair Trading Act 1987* to make it an offence to impersonate certain authorised officers.

Outline of provisions

Clause 1 sets out the name, also called the short title, of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Property and Stock Agents Act 2002 No 66

Schedule 1[2]–[4], [6]–[9], [11], [12] and [20] amend the PSA Act in relation to the maximum penalties for offences.

Schedule 1[5] permits the Secretary to exempt the holder of a licence or certificate of registration from the condition that the holder must comply with continuing professional development requirements.

Schedule 1[10] amends section 55 to clarify the requirements for agency agreements under the PSA Act, including the following—

- (a) a licensee is not entitled to commission for services performed unless there is a written agency agreement,
- (b) the Secretary may approve a standard form for agency agreements,
- (c) the regulations may provide for the terms and conditions that must be included in agency agreements.

Schedule 1[13] inserts definitions of *advertised selling price*, *commission*, *ESP guidelines*, *for sale sign* and *online advertisement* for the PSA Act, Part 5, Division 3. **Schedule 1[1] and [14]** make consequential amendments.

Schedule 1[15] omits section 72A from the PSA Act and inserts proposed sections 72A–72D for the following purposes—

- (a) proposed section 72A sets out the requirements for real estate agents in relation to the estimated selling price of residential property that must be included in agency agreements for the sale of residential property,
- (b) proposed section 72B permits the making of regulations and guidelines about estimated selling prices for residential property,
- (c) proposed section 72C requires a real estate agent to prepare a statement of information for a residential property in relation to the sale of which the agent has entered into an agency agreement,
- (d) proposed section 72D requires a real estate agent to include a selling price or price range in an advertisement for the sale of residential property, unless—
 - (i) the advertisement is a sign placed on or near the residential property, or
 - (ii) the agent is exempt from the requirement by regulation.

Schedule 1[16] makes it an offence for a real estate agent to advertise the selling price of a residential property as less than the following prices—

- (a) the estimated selling price for the property,
- (b) the amount of the highest bid made by a registered bidder at an auction at which the property was passed in,
- (c) the amount of a written offer to purchase the property that was rejected by the seller only for the reason that the amount offered was too low.

Schedule 1[18] requires a real estate agent to amend the advertised selling price of a residential property in response to the following—

- (a) the revision of the estimated selling price for the property,
- (b) the passing in of the property at auction,
- (c) the rejection by the seller of a written offer to purchase the property only for the reason that the amount offered is too low.

Schedule 1[17] inserts increased penalties for underquoting offences committed by real estate agents.

Schedule 1[19] amends the PSA Act, section 73A relating to underquoting in representations by real estate agents when marketing a residential property to prohibit agents from indicating that the property may be sold for less than the following prices—

- (a) the estimated selling price for the property,
- (b) the amount of the highest bid made by a registered bidder at an auction at which the property was passed in,
- (c) the amount of a written offer to purchase the property that was rejected by the seller only for the reason that the amount offered was too low.

Schedule 1[21] and [22] insert the following additional disciplinary actions under the PSA Act—

- (a) imposing a monetary penalty on a person to be paid, as decided by the Secretary, into the Property Services Statutory Interest Account or the Property Services Compensation Fund,
- (b) requiring a person to publicise a breach of the PSA Act or the regulations made under the PSA Act,
- (c) requiring a person, in a way approved by the Secretary, to engage an independent valuer for a stated period to verify the estimated selling price or the revised estimated selling price in an agency agreement entered into by the person, without the costs of verification being passed on to the seller,
- (d) requiring the licensee in charge, for a stated period, to approve the estimated selling price or the revised estimated selling price in all agency agreements entered into by the licensee's agency, without extra costs being passed on to sellers,
- (e) suspending a person from exercising certain functions authorised under their licence or certificate of registration,
- (f) requiring a person to provide an indemnity, to the extent and in the form specified by the Secretary, in relation to claims against the Property Services Compensation Fund arising from the person's conduct.

Schedule 1[23] makes an amendment consequential on the amendments made by Schedule 1[22].

Schedule 1[24] inserts proposed section 192A to provide for factors the Secretary must consider in determining appropriate disciplinary action under the PSA Act, section 192.

Schedule 1[25] inserts proposed section 210B to allow the Secretary to issue education notices to a licensee or a registered person if the Secretary reasonably believes the licensee or registered person has contravened—

- (a) a provision of the PSA Act or the regulations made under the PSA Act, or
- (b) a condition of a licence or certificate of registration.

Schedule 1[26] and [27] provide for the recovery of certain penalties and amounts as referable debts under the *State Debt Recovery Act 2018*.

Schedule 1[28] permits the Secretary to approve providers of education or training for the purposes of continuing and other professional development of licensees and registered persons.

Schedule 1[29] inserts savings and transitional provisions consequent on the amendments made by the proposed Act.

Schedule 2 Amendment of Fair Trading Act 1987 No 68

Schedule 2 makes it an offence for a person to impersonate an authorised officer within the meaning of the following provisions—

- (a) the *Fair Trading Act 1987*, section 67,
- (b) the *Community Land Management Act 2021*, section 210(6),
- (c) the PSA Act, section 204(1),
- (d) the *Strata Schemes Management Act 2015*, section 211B(1).

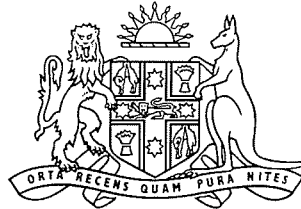
