Dear Elspeth,

Thank you so much for your email and for sending these materials. It was such a privilege to speak at the hearing for the Clean Indoor Air Inquiry on 19 February 2026 as well as hear others speak.

I also wanted to clarify a matter regarding a student's experience with black mould that I discussed in paragraph 2 on page 35 of the transcript. I realised while reviewing the transcript that I had accidentally misread parts of the quotes while speaking. Although this was not a material error, I have included the text of the quotes here for your further review:

- "feel it is possible I had been blacklisted for being so insistent on the repairs - which I was as I know the health impacts of black mould exposure."
- "I am fortunate I am able to rely on my partner and stay with him for the meantime however this means I have prolonged travel times to placement [...] Considering placement is full time and I have to study and do CV extracurriculars in my personal time, extended travel time means I have less time for this, which has a significant impact on my grades, future knowledge/skills, career opportunities, and mental health and overall wellbeing as I become less able to do things such as exercise regularly and eat healthy home cooked meals."
