I have not received a response from this communications officer who obviously can't communicate .This outlines the cold case of Docherty and Cavanaugh of which I was the first communicating officer. the NSW police are nothing more than Political Puppets hopefully it will change with new commissioner.

I am a former member of NSW police and the reporting officer of a cold case murder 1979 Kay Docherty and Toni Cavanaugh both teenage girls. I had come across a witness about 3 years ago who as a 12 year old in 1979 who lived along a Road Windang Road with his house opposite the Windang sand dunes who stated as a young person he saw a man who he identified as Ivan Milat hanging onto two young girls who were calling out he is going to kill us he told them to run in different direction Milat released these girls who went to a house along that road. On another occasion along the sand dune roads he observed a vehicle reversed up a sand dune and saw Milat coming over the top of the dune with a shovel on his shoulder. the house where the first two girls ran has come forward and when Milat was driving out of Bakers which leads to the dunes they stopped his car to retrieve their belongings.
