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Dear Parliamentarians,

Please consider this a submission to the inquiry into dingoes in National Parks in New South Wales.

In NSW dingoes are not protected under the Biodiversity Conservation Act, but hopefully this inquiry can amend that?

I am so concerned by the current use of 1080 poison, and by the baiting, trapping, and shooting of dingoes – practices that should have no place in a humane compassionate world, or the worlds of these sentient creatures.

These are the unceded lands of First Nations Peoples - please listen to their opinions on the cultural significance of the dingo in regards to any legislations, and for ongoing place-based decision-making and management (as set out in The First Nations National Dingo Declaration).

Financial support and services for the implementation of non-lethal, non-harmful coexistence strategies (to ensure that the interests of dingoes are protected, and to maintain their wellbeing) needs to be extended to landholders on the peripheries of National Parks, and to others such as First Nations groups maintaining these relationships.

Please recommend that dingoes are given full legislative protection in NSW, and that lethal or harmful control methods be replaced with humane, non-lethal alternatives - with full consultation and consent of First Nations Peoples.
