Hi there,

My name is _____, and I don't live in New South Wales. However, I saw the chance to make a statement for a native species that play such a large role in the eco system and I felt a strong need to submit this. I'd like to make it clear that not only are dingoes a part of a larger system, but they are also native animals that deserve reasonable and humane treatment. I encourage anyone, anywhere, to take a closer look at their native species which are classed as pests. See how they fit into the ecosystem system, have some care towards these animals as sentient beings. It's so disappointing to see this kind of thing happening all over the world. I understand impact needs to be managed, but there needs to be growth away from these brutal practices, there needs to be research and intention to change. I propose to end dingo killing within New South Wales National Parks and to protect the ecological function of dingoes.

Current policy manages dingoes in large generic pest management guidelines, even though there is ecological and genetic evidence showing dingoes as ecologically important NATIVE species.

I also propose more significant involvement of Cultural Custodians in the decisions and management of dingoes in National Parks, to make sure the cultural significance of dingoes is clear in legislation and management.

Co-management methods provide a foundation to integrate Indigenous knowledge systems into western science. First Nations peoples have valued for dingoes and Country for thousands of years, forming deep, long term connections that sustain the support of healthy landscapes, and biodiversity outcomes.
