## **INQUIRY INTO DINGOES IN NATIONAL PARKS IN NEW SOUTH WALES**

I believe its important to care for our Canis dingo families for the original Australian sustainabled eco system.

The importance of a natural living Canis dingo family within NSW parks is paramount to an original sustainable ecosystem. National parks obligation is to prioritise the existance and wellbeing of the original fauna, flora including landscapes and waterway the dingo is essential to this.

Through thousands of years canis dingo has established itself as a keystone species and its ways need to be studied and understood by NSW parks authorities guided by our first nations folk and Canis dingo conservationists.

Fortunately Canis dingo families are great self regulators and if left alone, over time can restablish thier populations as the Australian keystone species, along with the Wedge tail eagle.

With this knowledge of the dingoes sustainable role, nsw parks can design plans with a broader prospective creating inclusive management plans with farming primary producers, the department of primary industries and the department of tourism.

Dingoes play a natural cruitial role in bio diversity sustainable in many ways. Dingoes ( specifically the established dingo family) help control invasive species through predation and displacement, needless to say this is more relevant now than ever before. An example of this is the excessive Australian brumby population which exists where Canis dingoes have been subject to the government extermination programs. Had there been established family dingo populations the brumby would be contained in more appropriative areas with a lesser population. This is also evidant with the excessive numbers of cat and fox killings shown reguarly by hunters and shooters. Again more evidant where Canis dingoes have been displaced and exterminated via the dingo killing agendas of government Local Land Services and private land managers and owners.

The reintroduction of the removed American Wolf back within the Yellowstone national park is another great example of flora and fauna conservation, please see youtube flim ( How the wolves changed the rivers in Yellowstone natiinal park).

Canis dingo has a long and well regarded history which can be uterlized in tourism and education for NSW parks to profit from. As is done within other countries e.g. Cadnadian, African and America etc..for guided eco sefaries and education programs.
