

22 ORDER FOR PAPERS—BAYSIDE COUNCIL AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST—AMENDMENT TO RESOLUTION

Ms Sharpe (on behalf of Ms Moriarty) moved, according to notice, government business notice of motion no. 1: That, the resolution of the House of Wednesday 7 May 2025 relating to the order for papers regarding Bayside Council and conflicts of interest be amended by omitting "within 21 days of the date of passing of this resolution" and inserting instead "as soon as practicable following the completion of any relevant investigations by the Independent Commission Against Corruption and any associated criminal proceedings".

Debate ensued.

Mr Rath moved: That the question be amended by omitting all words after "be amended by" and inserting instead "inserting at the end of the opening paragraph "excluding material disclosed by ICAC to the OLG or the relevant Minister, or any material created by OLG or the relevant Minister, to the extent that it refers to or annexes Commission material.".

Question put: That the amendment of Mr Rath be agreed to.
